G-d, Israel, and the Torah are One

In this week's Torah portion we learn about Moshe's father-in-law, Yitro. Moshe Rabenu told Yitro about the miracle that G-d performed for the Jewish people, Bne Yisrael, by saving them from the Egyptians at Yam Suf, also known as the Re[e]d Sea. When Yitro heard about the miracle, he became very excited and decided to convert to Judaism and become part of the Jewish nation.

The question that arises is this: Why did Moshe only tell Yitro about the miracle, the parting of the sea? Why didn't he tell Yitro about the Torah and the mitzvoth that we received from Hashem?

The Ben Ish Hai answers that the story of Yitro teaches us a fundamental truth about the Torah. The non-Jewish nations of the world cannot understand our holy Torah properly, at a deep spiritual level. Having a good intellect and being smart is not enough. A person needs a soul, a neshama, that is connected with Israel, with its sanctity, and with the Jewish people to understand even a few simple sentences from the Torah. So even Yitro, who was a spiritual person, could not understand the Torah before he converted. Only then could Yitro understand the revelation at Mount Sinai. And Moshe would not tell Yitro about the Torah before he was ready.

The same is true for a Jewish person who clouds his neshama, his soul, and distances it from the Jewish people through actions such as eating the wrong foods for a Jewish person or by filling his brain with the false ideas of other religions. That is not the way of the Torah and can cause a person to lose the ability to understand the Torah properly. Such a person may then interpret the Torah in the wrong way, in accordance with his own desires and wishes.

That is one of the reasons we say this blessing every morning; to remind us to be grateful for the gift of Torah we received each week. Blessed are You G-d who chose us from among all the nations and gave us Your blessed Torah.

A Shabbat Song: Yom Yom Odeh La'El

This piyut was composed anonymously and is traditionally sung in the Iragi Jewish tradition on Shavuot. The piyut is sung primarily at the arrival of dawn after "Tikkun Lel Shavuot," the long night of Torah learning held on the eve of Shavuot. It's already not night, and yet it is not quite day either. Similarly, the piyut describes how the Jewish people stood in a suspended state, ready to receive the Torah at Mount Sinai. just before the occurrence of the momentous event. For this reason, the piyut is also sung on Shabbat days when the Ten Commandments are read. We sing This beautiful piyut before reading the Aseret Hadiberrot in Parashat Yitro and Parashat Va'et-hanan. Listen to my dear cousin R. 
